

Abstract

Estonian crisis policy measures are implemented with Emergency Act that addresses crisis management system to promote state resilience during crisis, defining services vital for continuity, including payment and cash circulation.

The aim of this thesis is to analyse the effectiveness of Estonian crisis management system measures ensuring continuity of payment and cash circulation services during emergency. The paper examines the alignment of Estonian policy with classical crisis management concept, intercedence of applied measures and how they assure availability of payment and cash circulation services during emergencies. This paper is conducted as an exploratory case study on basis of crisis management system and actors.
